2. Principal's Report

- Best way to communicate with Darren is by email <u>drussell@sd62.bc.ca</u>. It usually takes about a day for him to get back to you. If you need a quicker response, call Darren in the office. Darren's tel #250-478-5531, ext. 3925
- Darren is positioned at PEXSISE<u>N</u> due to proximity to CML. Glenn is at Dunsmuir and Pam is at Spencer full time. CML kids are helped by Darren, Glenn and Pam.
- Move-in day will be November 9 and 10. First day will be November 14. There are no changes to this date at this time. January opening dates are rumours no

one from the District has indicated that a November date isn't possible. There is currently plywood where windows need to be on the south side - still on revised track, still on budget.

- Our students and staff are making do in their temporary spaces. Playground is just going in at PEXSISE<u>N</u> playground will be available to grade 7 students in a couple weeks. Any questions about move in? Please let Darren know.
- Mascot update from Glenn. Mascot design is in final stages he has been working with artists and graphic designers we are going with bears. Main colour is maroon, secondary colours are black and white, with subtle shades of grey and green.
- October 7 there will be a presentation at Dunsmuir for a review committee of parents, grade 6, 7 and 8 students and staff who will view the progress and make decisions on the font and mascot if you would like more information about the presentation, email Glenn directly.

Q: Large group of families coming from Kettle Creek area - many are taking the railroad - is there any way to make the dirt hill a safe route to school? The concern is that kids are going to use this route anyway.

A: We do not have access. Darren is advocating for this because kids will go up there. It is not School Board property. Darren is having conversations with the City of Langford as it would be safer to have a proper path. This is City of Langford property. Parents are encouraged to contact the City, trustees, and school board. There is a walkway around the turf with a pathway that ends. There might be access in future on the far side of the turf field. Can we involve Arrive Safe? Email sent from PAC might help.

Discussion re Crosswalk - concerns about double round-a-bout - visibility is a concern. Speed is a concern in the area.

• Fundraising

Discussion re forming a small committee of 2-4 parents to spearhead fundraising efforts this year. Marie I. volunteered to help on the committee and get some initial fundraising efforts set up but is not able to lead the committee.

Q. What does fundraising look like for a middle school?

We had a bottle drive, we have a CO-OP number. It could be popcorn days, it could be Purdy's orders, spirit wear, etc. Hot lunch is a possibility but will require coordination with admin and volunteers. Some schools have done walk-a-thons that are really successful.

Darren confirmed that there is no canteen, store or cafeteria at the new school. The school will likely do Pizza Fridays which will be a school initiative. Some classrooms will do their own fundraisers.

- \$2,111.76 raised at bottle drive is the only thing that has gone through our general account

We have 515 students at Centre Mountain Lellum. 21 Divisions.

Review budget proposal for 2022/2023

Pam discussed proposed budget lines:

- If we get gaming funds, we can transfer some expenses from general to gaming account as allowed by BC gaming guidelines.
- BCCPAC annual membership dues are \$75.00 fees are due in December. Discussion re value of membership this year given our small bank account
- Bursary tabled
- Cheque order Pam tried her hardest to get free cheques. A cheque order from Cheques Plus 100 cheques for our General Account \$84.00, 100 cheques for gaming account \$39.00. Total including \$147.81 with taxes and shipping. We need a physical cheque to open an account with BC Gaming.
- Classroom funds we don't have any money to share with.
- Grade 6 immunizations are coming up. PAC usually provides juice for the day. 252 grade 6 students \$150.00.
- Grade 8 graduation celebration no funds yet hopefully that will change
- Leadership program 42 grade 8 students are already involved. They have started to organize a Terry Fox Run. A group wants to do a grade 8 leaving fund. Another group wants to do a ADST day, ie. Science World, Ski Day.
- Sports Fees about \$2500.00 for the year's fees we only have to pay \$100 up front, they have to pay the remainder in June.
- Operating Expenses \$150.00. Includes a cash tin (\$50.00) for PAC floats.
- Peninsula Co-op Gas Membership \$27.00. Tom paid this so we want to reimburse him.
- SPEAC has agreed to waive membership fees for the year.
- Student assistance typically we give this money to the office to help with food, supplies, etc. Darren normally catered lunches would come from Truffles parents would fill out a form we will not have that at CML we will have more of a need asking for assistance. Parents go directly to

Darren. Requests for support can be made confidentially to Darren. Darren thinks it can be used in a better place. *Tabled*
