School Goals: Each year our school sets and reviews our school goals based on what we are seeing and hearing from our students. This year, our 3 goals are:

- Foster a safe, welcoming, and engaging learning environment where all students feel valued, connected, and experience a strong sense of belonging.
- 2) Strengthen students' number sense (starting with a focus on mastering multiplication/division facts).
- 3) Strengthen students' reading comprehension.

• Homestay Family Needed: For 1 female student from Mexico (age 14), grade 8, arriving Sunday, January 25, 2026 (departing June 30, 2026)
The student's interests include swimming and outdoor activities. The ideal Homestay family will have children close in age (middle school age preferred), and have time to do activities with the student, and include them in family life in general.

Homestay settings must provide students with:

- a clean, safe, and well-organized living environment.
- a private bedroom (with a window large enough for escape), and which includes a comfortable bed, study table/desk, chest of drawers, closet/armoire, and desk lamp.
- o Wi-Fi access for students to use.
- Access to in-home laundry facilities.

Homestay families must provide students with:

- o an English-speaking home environment
- three substantial meals each day plus nutritious snacks.
- help arranging reasonable transportation such as car-pooling for extracurricular activities students might participate in and including transportation to/from ISP Activities/Trips (local drop off/pick up = Belmont for Westshore families).
- o airport (YYJ) or ferry (Swartz Bay) pick up upon arrival and drop off at departure.
- opportunities to participate in family activities and events/holiday celebrations.
- support for students' interests in cultural, athletic, and community activities.
- guidance and support reasonable to expect of adults who are assuming responsibility for the care of a young person who is far from their own family.

Families receive a monthly stipend for hosting, to offset the costs associated with hosting a student. Click here to apply for SD62 Homestay Program
